PASSING OF A CURRENT MCMA DIRECTOR

BOB "HAWK" HAWKINS

Robert D. Hawkins was born on November 7, 1934 on the prairie in Topeka, Kansas. He enlisted in the Marines in January, 1953 "to see exotic foreign people in far away places." He traveled to Hawaii, Korea, Japan, Marshall Islands and Viet Nam. He was selected for the Warrant Officer Screening Course in 1966 and returned to Viet Nam following commission as 2ndLt. From Viet Nam he was then assigned to Fort Sill, Oklahoma as a gunnery instructor. Following AWS and sea duty, was assigned to "boot strap" program and earned a BS from San Diego State University in 1975. After four years at Camp Pendleton, he spent the next six years on Navy staffs at Coronado and White Beach, Okinawa. While in Okinawa, he met and married his current wife, Barbara. Robert retired in 1987 and began working for the Civil Service, first with the Army in Okinawa followed by ten more years with the Navy in Bermuda and Japan. During his career, he was the recipient of several military awards. He was a Director of the Marine Corps Mustangs, a member of the Marine Corp League, and MOAA. Retired from Civil Service in 1999 he and Barbara moved to Pensacola, Florida. In 2010 he moved to Las Vegas, Nevada to be nearer to his family. On December 18, 2011 Robert passed peacefully and with grace surrounded by family. He is survived by his wife, four children, three step-children and numerous grand and great-grand children. On December 29, 2011 a memorial service was held at 10 AM at the "Grace in the Desert" Episcopal Church in Las Vegas, Nevada followed by a 2 PM military service at "Veterans Memorial Cemetery" in Boulder, Nevada. He will be sorely missed by friends, family, and comrades.


